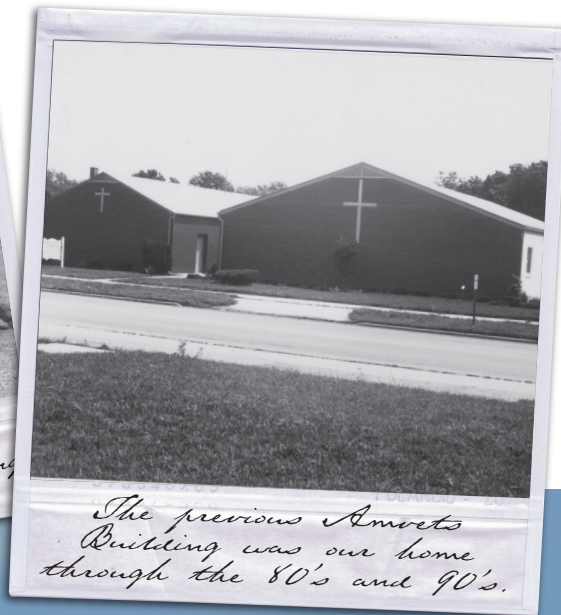

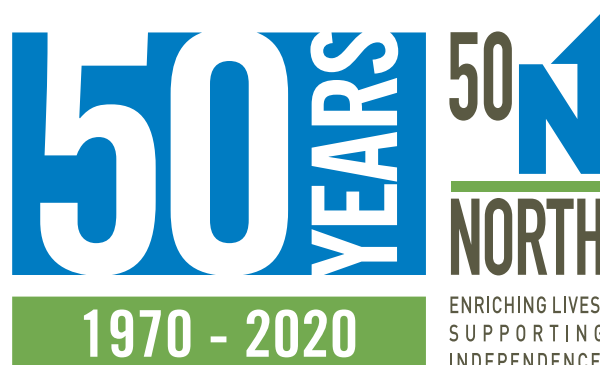

The 50 North Purpose

ACTIVITIES | CHORE | NUTRITION | OUTREACH | WELLNESS

2020 will always be remembered as the year of COVID-19. We were all impacted as a result of COVID-19 in one way or another. The uncertainty was great, the challenges numerous and the planning difficult.

However, COVID-19 did not stop us from delivering our mission of enriching lives and supporting independence of our county's older adults. We continued to provide our five key areas of:

Activities – lifelong learning through interesting classes, opportunities to socialize and travel;
Chore – home repair and maintenance, mobility assistance, and seasonal outside services;
Nutrition – on site lunch service, mobile meals, curbside café and grocery delivery;
Outreach – advocate, refer and assist older adults and the people who care about them;
Wellness – health and fitness programming and opportunities geared toward older adults.

2020 started out strong. From January 1 –March 11, 2020, 50 North experienced a 9% increase in membership and 26% increase in utilization compared during the same time period the previous year.

In 2019, 50 North Board approved the expansion and renovation to its facilities in response to growing demand for services and a growing need for space. A capital campaign to raise money for the project was launched and ground was broken for the expansion and renovation in March 2020, just as Governor DeWine shut down most of Ohio in response to an emerging COVID-19 pandemic. With lead gifts already secured and planning complete, the capital project went forward in spite of the health crisis.

From March 12-December 31, 2020, during the most difficult days of the COVID-19 shutdown, 50 North persevered in its mission and provided the following services to seniors:

- Delivered 14,419 mobile meals and served 6,844 Curbside Café pick-up meals
- Delivered 283 grocery orders
- Completed 1279 chore services and built 16 handicap-accessible ramps
- Provided 484 housekeeping services (625 for the entire year)
- Engaged 612 people in fitness activities and 781 people in enrichment activities in person or by ZOOM
- Telephoned 4,856 people to check in on them and to see if they needed anything
- Provided 1,438 people with 6,623 social services from our social workers, including:
- Finding housing and securing personal or financial assistance for moving

- Helping access Medicare, Medicaid, SNAP and HEAP benefits
- Connecting seniors with local food resources
- Assisting seniors in obtaining Emergency Response units
- Connecting to rent and utility assistance in partnership with local charities
- Connecting to local community services like the Alzheimer's Association and services at The Family Center

Although 2020 presented many challenges, many blessings were received. We are particularly thankful to the voters of Hancock County for their commitment to our seniors demonstrated by their consistent support of the senior service levy. We also recognize a sincere thanks is due to our donors who ensure our mission is provided. A listing of all the generous donors who supported 50 North in 2020 are published in this report.

Among 50 North's greatest assets are our wonderful volunteers. Due to COVID-19, 50 North had to suspend using volunteers for most of the year. When we were able to utilize volunteers, we welcomed them back with open arms. Finally, we thank all the Board of Trustees, staff and over 100 partnering organizations in Hancock County who work tirelessly together to Enrich Lives and Support Independence of people 50 and older.

We look forward to serve the needs of our seniors today and in the future.

The New 50 North Expansion & Renovation...

The planned expansion and renovation will double our available space to 45,000 square feet which will allow us to better serve Hancock County's growing senior population. Among the features of this project are:

- ① The **Fitness Center** will be equipped with a walking track, individual and group fitness spaces, locker rooms with showers, and wellness rooms
- ② **Dedicated spaces** for activities and meetings.
- ③ **Refurbished and reorganized kitchen** to provide more efficient space for the preparation and distribution of food from 50 North
- ④ Larger **Marathon Café** including stage area
- ⑤ **Dedicated space** for arts.
- ⑥ **Parking Lot Expansion** with all new **LED Lighting**.

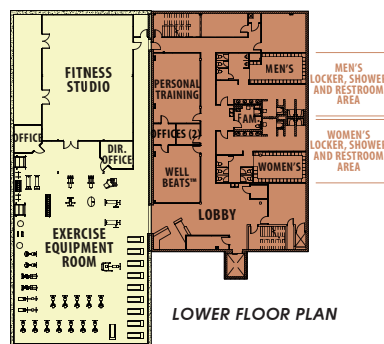
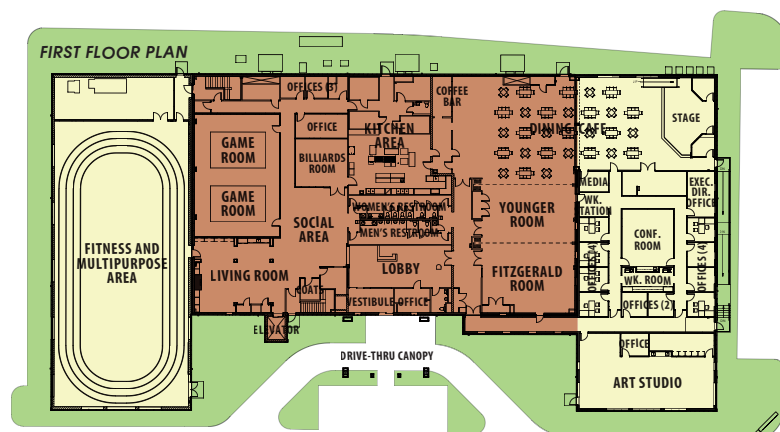

The Year of Covid-19

50 North closed its door March 12, 2020 for in-person activities, fitness, Café, and socialization, for what we thought would only be for two weeks. But as we learned, COVID-19 didn't go away that quickly.

50 North staff assessed the needs of seniors in Hancock County by making phone calls to over 6,100 older adults to find out how they were doing and asked what we could do to help. Many of the seniors told us they were feeling isolated, lonely and depressed. It is known that loneliness is linked to mental health issues as well as heart problems, diabetes, stroke, memory, drug abuse risk, sleep problems to name a few.

The seniors in Hancock County are like family to the 50 North staff. Early on in the pandemic, the priority for our staff was to check in with seniors to offer support, encouragement to stay safe, problem solve, provide linkage to another service or brainstorm ideas on how to help them with their "cabin fever."

As time went on and the community began opening up, 50 North staff were able to stop at senior's home wearing mask and distancing to connect with seniors. The state allowed 50 North to open our doors for fitness in June and then more activities were allowed to open up in September at a reduced capacity with mandated guidelines to ensure the safety and well-being of our members. The members were so happy.

But as winter was approaching, COVID-19 surged in our community. 50 North had to close yet again for in-person activities, fitness and socialization to keep our most vulnerable safe and well. All along, 50 North was delivering mobile

meals, delivering groceries, adopting a new meal program called "Curbside Café" where seniors order a meal and pick it up at 50 North, chores, housekeeping, finding housing and securing financial assistance, finding help for paying rent and utility bills, providing seniors with local food resources, assisting seniors with Medicare, Medicaid, Disability and Social Security applications, sending cards, games, care packages and other items to let seniors know they were not alone.

Along with offering these essential services, 50 North offered stimulating activities and fitness classes virtually by using Zoom and FaceBook. Virtual classes included Art in a Box Christmas Ribbon Tree, Understanding Alzheimer's and Dementia, Tuesday Trivia, Readers Theatre, Storytelling Workshop, Laugh Factory, Beginning Line Dancing, Name That Tune, Crime Prevention for the Holidays, BVHS: Treatment Options for Rotator Cuff Disease, Nature Notes with Hancock Park District, Ask the Professor: Fighting Fact News, Dietician Chat: Holiday Tips, Wheel of Fortune, Holiday Magic Christmas Concert, Name that Movie, Poetry and Tea, 50 North News, SilverSneakers Classic, Yoga, Cardio Energizer, Geri-Fit, Delay the Disease and Bootcamp and more.

As 2020 came to an end, phone calls that 50 North staff made to our seniors proved to be the most important work we did. 50 North was the front line of support for our seniors in Hancock County.

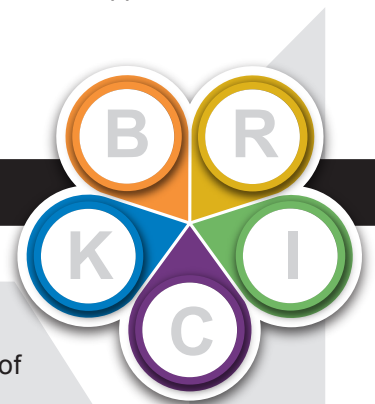

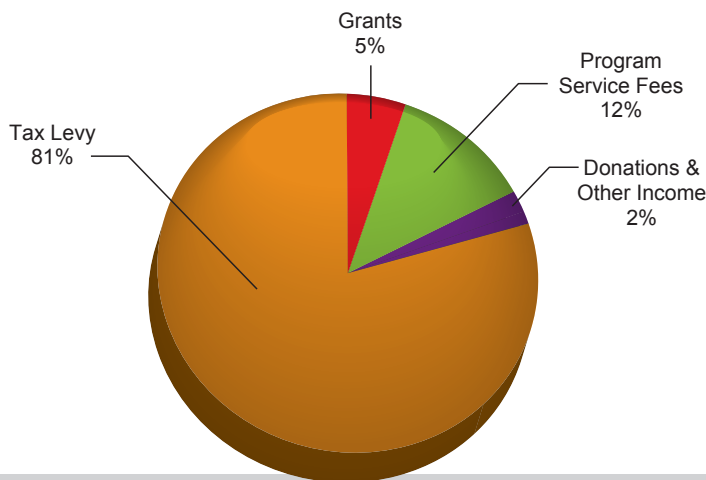

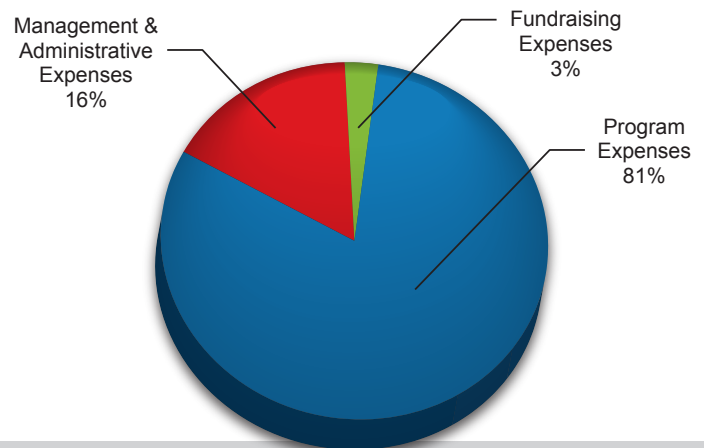

- The remainder comes from fundraising dollars and service fees

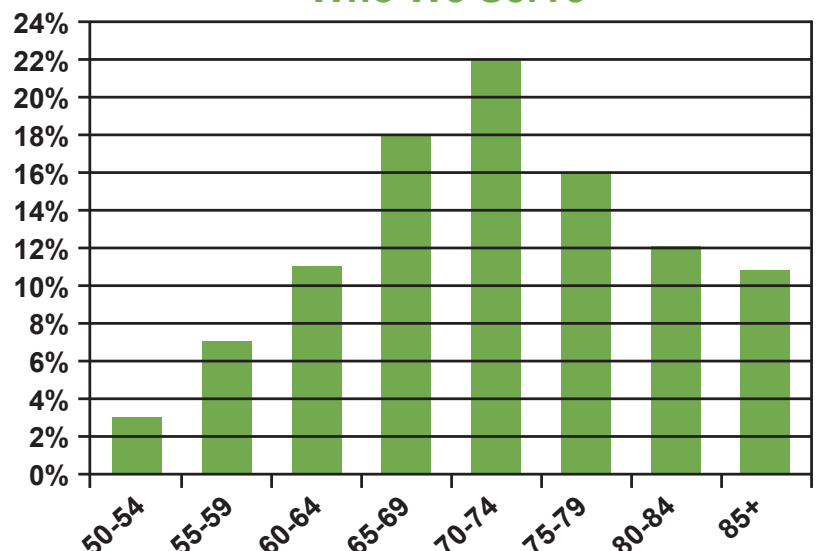
