The 50 North Purpose

At 50 North, it was a year of strong progress forward in our mission to Enrich Lives and Support Independence of older adults in Hancock County. Growing participation is evidence of that progress.

There are many governmental and nonprofit agencies that are doing important work for the benefit of our citizens. Only 50 North is focused exclusively on the well-being of our county's older adults. This singular focus allows 50 North to excel at identifying the full range of opportunities to support the enrichment and independence of older adults linking them to these opportunities.

The goal of 50 North is to help our county's older adults transition from a place of work, independence, and good or manageable health, through retirement and beyond. The growing need for varying levels of assistance to remain independent, and the increasing need for help managing health and concerns is the focus of 50 North. Through its activities, chore services, nutrition, outreach and wellness, 50 North helped Hancock County's older adults make this transition while maximizing their independence.

By the numbers in 2019:

- Nearly 25% of the Hancock County adults 55 and older are members of 50 North with an average of 31 visits per member and almost 10% of them are fitness members
- 50 North's Café served almost 24,000 meals and mobile meals delivered 23,600 meals for a total meal count approaching 50.000
- The Outreach department provided nearly 7,000 social services and information and referral calls
- And the Chore services department provided 6,336 hours of service.

In 2019, 50 North worked hard to protect and preserve Hancock County's older adults' autonomy and independence. As more people use the facility and services, waiting lists and tight spaces are the result. Waiting lists

and wait times, as well as tight spaces discourage people from participating in our activities and limit the number of people we can serve. Due to increasing demand driven partly by the changing age demographics in our county and partly by the excellent quality of service provided by our staff, 50 North embarked on a building expansion and renovation project to meet this demand today and into the future.

In 2019, 50 North secured 60% of the \$6M needed to complete this project. A list of our donors for this capital project is included in the Annual Report. We say a heartfelt thank you to those of you who have already expressed their support for this important project by making an early gift or commitment to give.

We are particularly thankful to the voters of Hancock County for their commitment to our seniors demonstrated by their consistent support of the senior service levy. We also recognize a sincere thanks is due to our donors who ensure that vital services such as Activities. Chores. Nutrition. Outreach and Wellness continue to be available.

Among 50 North's greatest assets are our wonderful volunteers. This year more than 460 individuals contributed thousands of hours of their time to make 50 North the best we can be.


