In 2024, 50 NORTH continued to grow, with more members and increased participation in our programs and services. Our mission is to help older adults and their families navigate life's transitions—from retirement to health challenges, and everything in between. Our programs are designed to enhance health, independence, and well-being, while fostering a strong sense of community.

Ohio's Aging Population (50 and Older):

- Current Statistics: 40.5% of Ohio's population is 50 or older, a significant portion of the state's demographic.
- Projected Growth: By 2030, over 1 in 3 Ohioans will be aged 50 and older, increasing the demand for services and support.
- Hancock County Focus: Over 30% of Hancock County residents are aged 50 and older, underscoring the need for programs that promote active and healthy living for this growing group.

**Compassion** We are committed to lead with our heart and genuinely understand, feel, and identify with the needs of those we serve.


**Kindness**We treat those we serve with kind acts and understand that kindness evokes more kindness. We believe the more kindness that exists, the more harmony there is likely to be.




